THE NEW BUSES HAVE ARRIVED!!!

During the Spring 2023 semester, we responded to the community recommendations by making our Transportation Department a priority.

At that time, we committed to purchasing 2 new buses each school year with the goal of replacing as many old units as possible over the next couple of years beginning the 2024-2025 school year.

As of February 2024, we have invested in **<u>THREE</u>** new buses and has the intention of securing a fourth bus by the end of this school year!

The new buses are already on the road! They easily identified currently because they do not yet have our district name on the side! These three units have been selected for their large capacity, air conditioning, and type of engine suitable for our terrain.

We are still a long way from replacing all the old units without air conditioning, but we are already ahead of our replacement schedule and we remain committed to making these changes happen.

LETTER GRADES & STATE TESTING

Our Baboquivari Middle and High School students along with the BUSD staff increased the Arizona Department of Education (ADE) letter grade rating from "F" (BMS)/"D" (BHS) to both "Cs" during the 2023-2024 school year. Their hard work paid off by setting a new bar for all of our schools and students this school year.

Congratulations students, staff, and parents for valuing education and expecting more from our students and our staff.

This rating is based on multiple domains including, but not limited to:

- 1. The percentage of students present taking the test
- 2. The percentage of students demonstrating academic growth
- 3. The percentage of students reaching the "proficiency" academic level
- 4. Graduation Rate
- 5. Performance on the ACT

During this time we ask that you:

- 1. Ensure students have set schedules so that they can have enough time to sleep and rest each night.
- 2. Ensure students are in school every day and that students do not get check out early
- 3. Offer a space for students to express their concerns about testing. Spend some time to let them know that you believe in them. Ask students how they feel about their test each day.
- 4. Remind students of the importance of school, learning, and test taking.

Let's continue to work together to ensure all of our schools reach a rating of "A".
