STATE TESTING ATTENDANCE DATA

One of BUSD's performance indicators are the state tests. The goal is that 100% of our students take these tests and take them seriously to determine what students are learning, how well they are learning it, and what additional support they may need.

This year, our schools reported the following percentages of students taking the test:

TRANSPORTATION UPDATES



During the Spring of 2023, BUSD made the commitment to improve our Transportation Department. One of the changes made was partnering with Bee Line Transportation to increase our available bus routes from 8 to 16.

A second commitment was made to purchase two (2) new buses each year for the next 8 years to replace our 16 buses. As of May 2024, BUSD has invested funds to purchase a total of 6 new buses for our students!

We will continue to uphold our commitment to ensure that students have a quality ride to and from school each day, as well as continue to support our field trips and extracurricular activities.

Be ahead of the game and set up for success for the upcoming school year! If you have not yet activated your ParentVUE account, call or stop by the school to get your account up and running!

BUSD has a parent portal, called ParentVUE, that is intended to provide parents, caregivers, and students immediate access to:

- 1. Attendance
- 2. Class Grade Books
- 3. Report Cards
- 4. Progress Towards Graduation (HS only)
- 5. And, More

This portal is available 24/7 to families to monitor students' progress in real time and to ensure we have the most current student contact information.

You can contact your child's teacher and ask for guidance, support, or clarification. Actively monitoring your students' progress will result in accountability and success. Two of our goals as a district is to connect with each other and that 90% of the parents will actively navigate the parent portal. Let's meet these goals and secure a solid future for our children.





SUMMER SCHOOL INFORMATION

BUSD will be holding summer school for K-12th grade students. There are different time frames depending upon grade level:

- May 28th through June 14th Three (3) weeks for K-8th grade students
- May 28th through June 21st Four (4) weeks for 9th-12th grade students

Both programs will be at the **Indian Oasis School Primary Campus** from 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

This program was created for students who are still in need of intense interventions or credit recovery. Families of students selected were contacted the week of May 6th through the 10th.

Third through 12th grade students must bring their laptops and chargers to school each day.
