## BHS STUDENTS, EMBER ANTONE & DAYNIESA MIGUEL ADVOCATE IN WASHINGTON, D.C.

Each year, over 200 school districts serving Native American students gather in Washington, DC, to advocate for Impact Aid, a federal education program. Impact Aid reimburses school districts due to the presence of nontaxable federal property.

For the last two years, BUSD has opened the invitation to any student that is willing to seek sponsors to join us in this advocacy crusade. In D.C., district representatives and students meet with state representatives to ask them to join the Impact Aid Coalition, to increase the Impact Aid allocation, and cosponsor the advancing towards Impact Aid full funding.

In March 2025, BHS students, Ms. Ember Antone from Gu Achi District and Dayniesa Miguel from San Xavier District proudly served as BUSD Ambassadors. Their voice and personal stories strengthened the message of how vital Impact Aid is for our community.

The points emphasized during our visits with representatives included how this funding pays for our transportation department, some culture teachers, counselors, classroom technology, competitive wages to attract and retain teachers, and maintain affordable housing for staff.

As the BUSD Superintendent, I was proud of Ms. Antone and Ms. Miguel for their leadership, advocacy, and determination.

I would like to extend our appreciation to San Xavier District and Gu Achi District for valuing our students leadership and advocacy development by sponsoring our students.



### **BUSD HIGHLIGHTS**

As a state funded, public school district, BUSD continues to find ways to improve its services and be an educational option for our students in our community.

Some of this year's highlights include:

### **TRANSPORTATION**

BUSD has replaced a total of 9 buses and is currently leasing 9 more increasing the reliability of our equipment and safety of our students/staff. All buses are equipped with air conditioning and many of them with surveillance cameras

Our transportation department is working on the logistics to release our transportation App to inform parents when the bus is arriving, if a student got on the right bus, or any group notifications.

### **CTE PROGRAMS**

BHS offers Career and Technical Education (CTE) opportunities to attract students to school and engage in experiences that allow them to explore their interests. We currently offer: AgriScience, Automotive Technologies, Culinary Arts, Digital Communications, and Digital Photography. Next year, we will be adding the Home Health Aide program!

These programs provide students with the opportunities to develop their skills through our multi-year programs and allow them to obtain industry certifications to assist with their post-secondary goals!

### ELEMENTARY ELECTIVES

Our Primary and Intermediate admin teams continue to make every effort to find elective courses to enrich the academic experiences for students from preschool to 6th grade. Some of the electives include Tohono O'odham Language, Art, Sports, STEM, and Library. The courses offered are based on the staff that is available and hired each year.

### **MTSS**

As the world for our students, parents, and staff becomes more complex, BUSD continues to explore ways to refine its Multi-Tiered System of Supports. Currently, students have access to a behavioral specialist, a counselor, credit recovery, intervention classes, summer school, and social/emotional support. BUSD also partners with the Cook Center that offers free parenting coaches to all parents interested.

### SI'ALIG KI:

What sets BUSD apart from many other districts is our Si'alig Ki:, aka Sunrise House.

This community center seeks donations to support our families including clothing, hygiene items, food, and workshops. Each month, this department serves over 100 families and distributes over a ton of food. Best of all, it is FREE to all community members.

### ESS/PSYCH SERVICES

BUSD has a system in place to evaluate students who may need specialized instruction or receive related services stipulated on the IEP's.

Over 160 students are currently being served by our Exceptional Student Services team.

## EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Many of our students are taking advantage of our athletics program, including football, cross country, volleyball, basketball, track and field, baseball, and softball.

In addition, our Primary students are enjoying their after school programs such as running, STEM, and Oidag.

### **FOOD SERVICES**

BUSD has partnered with Southwest Foodservice Excellence (SFE) that takes the time to meet with and survey students each quarter to determine the quality and service of the food.

Based on students' recommendations, food can be added or removed from the menu, in accordance with nutritional guidelines.

One of the improvements this year has been offering multiple choices of meals. At the secondary level, there are 6 options to choose from: 3 hot meals, 2 cold meals, and/or a snack bar.

## MAINTENANCE & OPERATIONS

Our Director of Operations has applied for additional state grants to improve the equipment and aesthetics of our schools. Our Director has successfully secured over \$11 million to repair the roofs district-wide, renovated the kitchen at the Primary and is currently painting/weatherizing all sites.

### **FAMILY LIAISONS**

Another service that sets our District apart is that each one of our schools has a parent liaison that supports in delivering information, support with registration information, transports students during special circumstances, and assists at the Sunrise House.


### 2025-2026 ONLINE REGISTRATION OPEN NOW!

The 2025-2026 enrollment window is now open. Our new enrollment system in ParentVue was designed to be a friendly and fast process.

We ask that all families begin enrolling students now. Our registration deadline is Friday, June 13, 2025.

BUSD needs this information to determine what changes need to be made to the bus routes, order supplies for students and staff, order food for students, determine class sizes, if teachers need to be added or relocated, and more.

Please be proactive and help us enroll all students by the targeted date. Waiting until the last minute reduces the time we have to make the necessary preparations for our students.

## ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE POLICY

Baboquivari Unified School District was awarded the Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) grant in 2023 and 2024 to upgrade our cameras, intercoms, front door access equipment, and chemical detectors in our schools and department buildings to improve school safety across the district.

The installation of the equipment is expected to be completed by May 2025. The Governing Board approved Board Policy ECAB on June 11, 2024, which was created to ensure the safety and security for district students and to safeguard district facilities, vehicles, and equipment.

Only authorized staff, such as IT department, district and school administrators, security, and/or staff authorized by the Superintendent and whose job description requires access, will have access to the surveillance equipment.

Staff will be trained in how to protect student information and ensure that only the necessary information is shared with individuals with direct involvement in the investigation.

In case of a major threat, such as an active shooter, BUSD will be able to share live views with law enforcement to assist in keeping students safe and contain any threats.

The intent of the updated equipment includes:

- Improving security at schools and on school grounds through the implementation of evidence-based school safety programs and technology
- Implementing school safety measures that help to promote a positive school climate that does not detract from the mission of the school to educate students or negatively impact the health and well-being of students

### COMING SOON: STOPFINDER, TRANSPORTATION APP

We're excited to introduce Stopfinder, a new app designed to improve communication and provide real-time updates for families using BUSD transportation services.

### What is Stopfinder?

Stopfinder is a parent-friendly transportation app that allows families to stay informed about their child's bus route in real time. With this tool, we're enhancing both convenience and peace of mind for our community.

### When is it available to download?

Parents will receive an email invitation from the BUSD Transportation Department when it's time to download and activate the app. <u>Please keep an eye on your inbox in the coming weeks!</u>

### How will the app support the Transportation Department, students, and families?

<u>For families</u>, they will be able set up notification points to be alerted when the bus is approaching. It will also let them know whether their child has boarded the bus.

*For the Transportation Department*, this means faster communication and a more efficient way to ensure student safety.

### What can families expect from the app?

Stopfinder is easy to use and customizable, providing real-time bus tracking, alerts, and student ridership details—all from a mobile device.

### What support is needed from families?

To ensure a smooth rollout, we ask that parents contact their child's school to confirm that their contact information—especially their email address—is up-to-date. This step is essential for receiving the app invitation.

### Who do families contact for support?

Once the app is launched, any questions or support needs can be directed to Timothy Ford in the Transportation Department.

## BSC TEACHER, JOSEPH MEASE, SELECTED AS FINALIST FOR TEACHER OF THE YEAR


