TRAINING OBJECTIVES





A Controlled Release is similar to the normal release of students. The difference is, a Controlled Release occurs at a different time than the normal daily release. A Controlled Release may occur due to bad weather, chemical spill, utility failure, or other non-traumatic condition that requires students to be released. During a Controlled Release parents are notified the school is closing early and students are being sent home.

CONTROLLED RELEASE





Reunification occurs when events at the school or in the vicinity requires students be physically returned a legal guardian, due to criminal activity, injury, death, or when additional time may be needed for law enforcement interviews or crisis counseling.
